Gisborne claimants also supported the new approach by holding an overview week of hearings based on evidence that supported all claims in the district. Claimant's post-settlement planning is progressing well. Twelve mapbooks were produced to support claimant evidence to the Waitangi Tribunal. The following milestone was not achieved: establishment of one cluster to progress all claims in the district.

The Trust has held a number of research consultation hui, and claimants undertook a research review exercise to familiarise themselves with research for the entire district.
